	Name	Topic of Discussion
1.	John Kohl	Bond Issue: Feels a modification to \$30 million will appeal to voters and feels needs should be prioritized.
2.	Ken Wolnik	Bond Issue: Wants to be informed about the Board actions and how they are representing the taxpayer. Also concerned about custody and care of buildings.
3.	John Ranucci	Bond Issue: Would like to see \$54 million funded to cover original plan as it has already been pared down and prioritized to bare minimums.
4.	Julie Cronin	Bond Issue: Priorities are different per individual. Worried about voter fatigue when it comes to passing something now and coming back later for additional monies.
5.	Holly Michalke	Bond Issue: Communicate importance of keeping our educational standard. Academics and Arts are both important and impact our students. Community should seek information to make an informed vote.
6.	Ida Eleck	Bond Issue: In favor of addressing all the needs as presented at one time. We owe it to our children.
7.	Vincent Weimer	Bond Issue: We need to be real and honest in regard to what could happen if the safety/security needs are not addressed. \$50 million will only scratch the surface of our facility needs.
