1. **CALL TO ORDER.** President Heidi Dolezal called the Regular Meeting of the North Royalton Board of Education to order at 7:00 p.m., July 14, 2009, at the North Royalton High School Community Room.

2. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.** President Dolezal requested all present to join in the pledge of allegiance to the flag.

3. **ROLL CALL.** Present: President Heidi Dolezal, Vice-President Cheryl Hannan, Leonard Reinhard, Barbara Zindroski, and Anne Reinkober. Also in attendance were Superintendent Edward Vittardi, Treasurer Richard McIntosh, and Personnel Director Gregory Gurka.

President Dolezal noted that agenda items had been reviewed and discussed at a previous meeting. Any changes to the agenda since last reviewed were noted.

5. **RECOGNITION OF GUESTS AND PRESENTATIONS.** There were no presentations to the Board for the evening.

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6. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION.** President Dolezal welcomed comments from the audience on any school or agenda topic. There were no speakers from the audience.

7. **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Mrs. Zindroski attended the June 12 Ohio Council of School Board Attorneys Spring Seminar and June 26, OSBA Sports Law Workshop and presented the following report:

1. Indicated that all staff creates public records with Blackberries, text messages and live chats.
2. Distance/Online Learning –
 - Under US copyright law – the student owns all rights of copyright in and to the work they create as part of their education.
 - As in TEACH Act where
 - The performance/display must be:
 - Part of a systematic mediated instructional activity
 - At the direction or under the actual supervision of the instructor
 - An integral part of the class session
 - Technological measures must reasonably prevent retention beyond the class session.
3. Misconduct 101
 - School staff does not need to use text messaging for students. Staff should not be on facebook or my space regarding giving information about themselves or getting information about students.
 - Excessive texting is now happening, especially with coaching. There were incidents cited of coaches texting several hundred times within a few days. Coaches contacting students very late at night or even during the hours of midnight and 2 a.m.
 - Suggestion that if students text any staff member, that staff member should not reply.
4. What is the philosophy of SPORTS –
 - It should be about Life Learning Lessons and developing a student to be a great citizen.
 - This is what most public individuals consider sports, a way to get scholarships. This has become a problem when considering those students who find themselves not eligible to play.
 - They discussed coaches be educated in the Ohio Bylaws and training should be provided to non-teaching coaches – this was mandatory.
 - Again in both sessions, I attended the use of technology networking with students was to be eliminated.
 - Pre-season meetings for participating student athletes and their parents should be mandatory for every season and every sport.
 - a. Review student eligibility requirements.
 - b. Review school's athletic code-of-conduct
 - c. Review sportsmanship, ethics, integrity components
 - d. New DVD available for 2009-2010
 - Suggested for students in the heat or working out that coaches weigh students in and out. For every 1 lb lost student should drink 16 oz. of water.
5. Coaches should consider having a service week to raise funds for a charitable organization. All students of that team should participate in raising funds for this charitable organization. Again this was to assist students in a life learning practice not just the sport itself.
6. Especially important – If there is an issue with returning students back to school at a reasonable time -- having that student in class the next morning should be taken into consideration. Example having bus trouble, getting stuck in traffic and getting detoured and then returning to school at 2 am. Does the district really expect those students to be in class the next morning?
7. Try to get students to purchase all tickets for games while in school. Presale ticket bonus can assist the district because the school keeps half of this.
8. Booster Organizations –
 - A booster group or organization may donate funds to the district and then the district can use those funds to pay the salary of a coach or advising position.
 - However, a booster group or other entity may not compensate a coach or advisor to supplement the salary the district pays.
 - Booster organizations can use the funds to help assist students pay for "Pay to participate."

NREF – As reported by Ms. Zindroski, the next meeting will be August 17 at 10:00 a.m. at the Administrative Building.

Summer school programs decreased from last year of 249 to 167 this year. It was felt that the economy was the reason for the decline in enrollment. Largest class was in Algebra 1.

Lastly, CVCC and Associate School Districts Enrollment History and Projections-6/2009

The study was initiated to confirm and quantify assumptions that were being made about the growth of CVCC and the Associate School Districts in the Career Technical Planning.

The study indicated that there are no projected significant increases in the enrollment of the North Royalton School District. However, CVCC the report indicates that there will be a significant increase in enrollment and this could be due to the present economic situation. A full report is available for your review from CVCC.

Curriculum – Mr. Reinhard gave the following report:

Tonight's agenda includes approval to pilot vocabulary development programs in grades 1 – 8. Staff members have volunteered to be involved and professional development will accompany these pilots. The agenda also includes stipend approval for 2 additional staff members who attended our summer professional development.

Our June professional development activities were attended by 64 staff members and well received. Thanks to our participants and to the following instructors: Deb Vasenda, Susan Finelli, Mary Barnes, Kathryn Hindall, Marta Malutza, Susanna Schwab, Shannon Winkler, and Denise Daugherty.

The district OGT and OAT results have been examined. It is anticipated that when official results are released that the district will once again be rated Excellent attaining 29 out of 30 indicators (if questioned, we fell below the target for 8th grade social studies which was the most difficult test across the state). As with many districts we will have to work on our AYP designation, but fully expect to be at or near our goal of being among the top 5 achieving districts in Cuyahoga County. Each building raised its Performance Index with the district up 2.9 points to 105.7.

This and other information was examined when formulating and submitting the CCIP for approval.

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The state of Ohio has begun the process for revising the Ohio Academic Content Standards in language arts, mathematics, science, and social studies. It has also adopted Physical Education Standards. We will keep an eye on these developments as they will impact our Course of Study revision process.

Building and Grounds – Mrs. Dolezal gave the following report on building/grounds maintenance issues:

1. Construction of a new MD Unit (Multiple Disabilities Unit) is well underway at the HS. We are taking an existing classroom and office space and converting it into a room where both classroom instruction and life skills will be taught to the students. The one area will contain a ADA compliant restroom, washer and dryer and a bedroom area where students will be taught how to do the laundry, fold clothes, make a bed, and put away clothes in a dresser. We will also have a full kitchen that will be ADA compliant to teach the students how to cook and prepare foods. Finally, a door is going to be constructed out to the courtyard area so the students can go outside and potentially in the future plant a small garden to grow vegetables. All of the re-modeling work is being done by the maintenance dept.
2. We have contracted with a sports surface coating contractor to do repairs and re-paint the track at the stadium. There are a number of areas that need to be addressed for our track teams.
3. The Albion Roof Replacement Project over the Media Center has been completed and the contractor is now working at the HS. They have approx. 50% of the roof area over the Science Labs in the 200 Section done and will soon be starting on the PAC Roof Replacement Project. All work is scheduled to be completed in early August.
4. The Middle School Roof replacement project which is being done under a warranty project (no cost to the school district) is well under way and should be done in the next few weeks.
5. Mr. Presot has been around to all of the buildings and the summer cleaning crews are doing a wonderful job of preparing the buildings for the upcoming school year. The Paint Crew is busy painting classrooms, hallways and stairwells. They will also be touching up curbs and fire lanes outside of the buildings as well.

Policy – Mrs. Hannan gave the following report: The July 2009 policy updates are presented for second reading and appear on tonight's agenda for approval.

Finance – Mrs. Reinkober reported that the next meeting will be scheduled for late August.

Mrs. Reinkober also reported on the first meeting of the City of North Royalton's Earth, Energy and Environment Committee. The discussion centered on the City's efforts to increase participation in the recycling program. The city would also like to partner with the school district to increase awareness of the benefits of recycling.

NR Recreation Board – Mrs. Dolezal noted that the next meeting is scheduled for 6:00 pm on July 28 at City Hall.
