5. **RECOGNITION OF GUESTS AND PRESENTATIONS.** Middle School Principal Kirk Pavelich discussed the Honor Society, “Fuel Up to Play 60 Program,” and WEB. Three NRMS students, along with their advisors, highlighted activities involved with WEB (Where Everyone Belongs).

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6. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION.** The public is invited to speak to any of the agenda items and other school topics at this time. Comments should be limited to five minutes. One speaker addressed the Board.

Mr. Donald Langshaw (4848 Dublin Drive; North Royalton, OH) presented his concerns on the issues of the Stadium Project and Drilling for gas on school property.

Mr. Vittardi responded to the speaker on some of his concerns while Mr. McIntosh addressed the issues dealing with financial concerns.

7. **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

Building & Grounds – Mr. Reinhard

1. The maintenance department is in the process of putting in several large catch basin next to Albion Elementary to address some flooding issues that we have experienced over the last few years. The new drains will hopefully eliminate the flooding issues that we experienced. The flooding has caused damage to the music and art rooms along with the Media Center.
2. The synthetic track surfacing has been completed as of this weekend. The track is currently being stripped/painted and should be done by Tuesday afternoon. The contractors are still finishing minor punch list items.
3. The maintenance department is working on some HVAC Issues with the start up of the boiler systems at the buildings.

City Recreation Board – Mr. Reinhard

Recreation Board meeting minutes will be reported at the next regular Board meeting.

Transportation – Mr. Reinhard

On September 23rd we held our first Transportation Committee meeting of this school year. We had a nice turnout of 8 parent building reps. The committee heard four appeals and no changes to current bus stops were recommended.

In the Garage, the mechanics addressed 150 repair orders in the month of September.

Bus 47 was the last bus waiting for Highway Patrol annual inspection for the 2011-2012 school year. Repairs have been completed and the bus has been approved for use.

The paperwork for the bus heater grant arrived last week and was signed by Treasurer Rich McIntosh. This will allow the installation process to begin soon.

At the Bus Facility we have been busy working with the drivers on the T-1 state report. This is a weeklong count of ridership and mileage which must be done the first full week of October. We created a new form which is easier for the drivers to use and closely mirrors the form that the Ohio Department of Education uses. I will be able to report those figures to you in the next update.

Curriculum & Pupil Services – Mrs. Dolezal

Pupil Services:

Home Schooling applications were approved for 46 students from 22 families.

As of Friday October 7, 2011, 87% of parents have registered their children through the INFOSNAP process.

Principals, counselors and psychologists attended the District 504 meeting on September 27, 2011. Currently the district has approximately 1 % of students who have disabilities under Section 504.

Pupil Services and the Curriculum Department are supporting the Building level Teams. To date initial meetings have been held in all 6 buildings. The teams have reviewed the District data and the data from their individual buildings. All buildings are working to develop action steps to support the district Goal of improving reading and math achievement through increased collaboration and the development of common assessments.

Curriculum and Instruction:

We have just completed our benchmark assessments for all students in grades K-8. These assessments give teachers and principals valuable data about students and they use the data to design instruction, intervention, and enrichment.

The third grade students just finished taking the fall Ohio Achievement Assessment in reading. We should have the results of this assessment in early November.

Students in grades two, four, and six will be taking the Cognitive Abilities Test (CogAT) during the next few weeks to help with the requirements of gifted identification.

NREF – Mrs. Dolezal

The next NREF meeting is scheduled for October 18 at 3:30pm at the Board Office.

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Policy Committee- Mr. Langshaw gave the following report:

Policy Committee did not have a meeting this month. Next Policy Committee Meeting will be held on November 10th at 5:30pm at the Board Office Conference Rm.

Legislative Liaison Update-Mr. Langshaw gave the following report:

On September 15th I attended the Cuyahoga County Council Intergovernmental Relations & Collaboration Committee & NOCCA Fall Public Forum on: How the Six Year County Property Reappraisals and the Appeals Process Impact Municipal Budgets. This was a very informative event.

HB 136 school choice update

The House Education Committee met on Sept. 21 to hear HB 136, a bill that seeks to expand school vouchers to all public schools in the state. By a close vote of 12-10 it was approved out of committee. Thank you to Representative Marlene Anielski for being one of the no votes. The legislation now awaits action by the full House on the House Floor. If passed by the House, the legislation will then continue the legislative process in the Senate. A House Floor is not expected until after the November Election. Thank you to my fellow board members for signing a joint board letter of opposition against this bill that was sent to all our lawmakers in Columbus. We need to continue to contact our lawmakers on this.

Senator Tom Patton selected as Senate majority leader

The Ohio Senate Republican Caucus unanimously elected Sen. Tom Patton Senate majority floor leader for the remainder of the 129th General Assembly. He replaces former Sen. Jimmy Stewart, who resigned from the Senate earlier this year. This is good news for us since he is our State Senator.

Redistricting and election dates

HB 319, the legislation creating new congressional districts, was expeditiously carried through both the Ohio House of Representatives and Ohio Senate this past month prior to landing on the Governors desk for signature. The legislation was signed by the governor on Sept. 26 and becomes effective immediately. Our congressional district did change but not our state senate and state house districts have remained pretty much the same. You can check out the new districts on the Ohio Secretary of State's website at <http://www.sos.state.oh.us/>. Don't forget to vote in the November 8th General Election.

Ski Boxes- Mr. Langshaw gave the following report:

I just wanted to thank Superintendent Vittardi and our Building Principals for embracing the Ski Box program I presented a few months ago in which a special box is kept in each building where students can give an anonymous tip about any fellow student who is a victim of bullying or even worse thinking of suicide. Our Principals and Guidance Counselors have access to these boxes and can intervene. The program was started by our State Representative Marlene Anielski after the tragic death of her son. I believe all our buildings now have these boxes. These simple boxes can make a huge difference and even possibly save lives. Again thank you!

CVCC – Mrs. Hannan

The five year forecast for the CVCC and the menu for the combined board meeting of November 3, 2011 were shared with the board. In addition, all in attendance were reminded to vote for the CVCC levy. It is a five year renewal levy for 1 mill and it provides 40% of their budget.

Partnership for a Healthy North Royalton- Ms. Reinkober

The Partnership for a Healthy North Royalton (formerly the Family and Civic Engagement Committee) met on September 28. Last spring, the district applied for a Drug Free Communities Mentoring Grant. This is a Federal grant, distributed by the Department of Education. As part of the grant, we have become a mentee coalition and work with CAPA (Community Awareness and Prevention Association) that works with the Brecksville/Broadview Heights School District. Only twenty grants were awarded in the United States and we were the only recipient in the State of Ohio. The grant is for \$75,000 for each of two years.

Though the focus of the committee has narrowed to substance abuse, prevention and variables leading to addiction, it still addresses the need to identify barriers to student success in school and to partner with services within the community to help students and their families overcome these barriers.

The committee is currently balancing its representation from the twelve sectors named in the grant: youth, parents, media, law enforcement, school officials, faith-based organizations, fraternal organizations, state, local and tribal government agencies, healthcare professionals, business and other community representatives.

The committee will be participating in the Health, Wellness and Community Expo on October 29 and has a SCENE event planned for November 9. Though the full program for that evening has not been formalized, part of the SCENE meeting will include a survey to assess community needs.

The next committee meeting is scheduled for October 26 at 2:45 in the Middle School Loft.

Financial Advisory Committee – Mrs. Reinkober

The Financial Advisory Committee met on September 27. The group reviewed the updated financial data since our last meeting in the spring. At the next meeting, scheduled for October 26, information on the five –year forecast will be available for the committee to review.
