1. **CALL TO ORDER.** President Leonard Reinhard called the special meeting of the North Royalton Board of Education to order at 7:00 p.m., Wednesday, November 17, 2010, in the North Royalton High School Community Room.
2. **PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE.** President Reinhard requested all present to join in the pledge of allegiance to the flag.
3. **ROLL CALL.** Present: President Leonard Reinhard, Vice-Pres. Anne Reinkober, Dan Langshaw, Cheryl Hannan, and Heidi Dolezal. Also present were Superintendent Edward Vittardi, Treasurer Richard McIntosh, Assistant Superintendent James Presot, Personnel Director Gregory Gurka, staff, media, and visitors.

Mr. Reinhard noted that all the agenda items had been reviewed at a previous Board work session. Any changes/additions since that time were presented. He also noted that meetings are now being audio taped and anyone wishing to address the Board must complete a Public Participation Form and submit it to the Board President. Mr. Reinhard read a Carl Jung quote on the subject of curriculum and teaching submitted by Curriculum & Instruction Director Bruce Bradley. Board President Leonard Reinhard will provide the quote for December.

5. **RECOGNITION OF GUESTS AND PRESENTATIONS.** Larry Pfrogner, Director of Professional Development at Ashland University, presented the Outstanding Adjunct Award to Curriculum & Instruction Director Bruce Bradley for his commitment to curricular programming in their Professional Development Program.

High School Asst. Principal Michael McGinnis recognized Mr. Richard Nestoff for his efforts in attaining a \$500 grant award from First Energy (CEI) for a project associated with a green house for special education in the high school courtyard.

In addition, three high school students, Tyler Gibson, Brian Long, and John Schomer, were recognized for their National Merit Commendations.

6. **PUBLIC PARTICIPATION.** President Reinhard welcomed comments from the audience on any school or agenda topic. There were no speakers from the audience.

7. **COMMITTEE REPORTS.**

**Curriculum & Pupil Services** – Ms. Dolezal

- The District Leadership Team continues to meet on a regular basis. Each meeting, new teacher co-chairpersons are selected to help co-facilitators Bruce Bradley and Sue Welch create a meaningful agenda. We presently are engaged in detailed discussions about current instructional practices in classrooms.
- The high school administrative staff, along with Bruce Bradley and Sue Welch is continuing discussions on methods to help our special needs students perform at a higher level on the Math OGT. We are looking at short term and long term solutions to this issue.
- Our Co-Teaching teams at the high school have expressed a need for graphic organizers to help students understand concepts in a format that is easy for them to understand. A software solution called Inspiration does this. Training with Deb Vasenda has been scheduled and updated licenses will be purchased using Title II D funds.
- Susan Finelli continues to work with teachers in grades 1-8 in the selection of a math benchmark tool that teachers will use as universal screeners. She and the group of teachers have narrowed the field down to two, and we are confident that we will be making a selection in the next few weeks.
- The middle school administrative staff along with the curriculum staff has been looking at servicing students in reading through Title I funding. We are currently looking at study data to determine the number of students that would benefit from this service, and how it would work operationally in the middle school schedule.
- The school counselors and the school psychologists met on November 2 to begin to address the strategic plan issues of how to measure and document support for individual students in the areas of career and social –emotional development.

**Capital Conference Report** – Ms. Dolezal

Break-out Session “Education All Students for the Future” presented by state superintendent Deb Delisle.

State report card as a whole:

- 88% of Ohio districts were effective or higher (an increase of 3%)
- 68% of schools were effective or higher
- Ohio met 18 out of 26 indicators, or 69% (an increase of 6%)
- Ohio’s graduation rate was 83% (a decrease of 1.2%)

She stated the economy depends upon a strong education system. And Ohio’s growing industries are: health care, alternative energy, technology, security, public policy, and education.

Academic content standards have been revised. The standards reflect college and career readiness, content and skills, coherence, focus, and rigor. The next steps are to develop web-based models curricula so districts can integrate the new standards in the classroom. The State Board of Education must adopt the model curricula by March 2011.

**NR Educ. Foundation** – Ms. Dolezal announced that the Texas Hold “Em Tournament was held last Friday. It appears the profit will be in the area of \$2500.

The profit from the Spaghetti Dinner was \$596.22. This is down a little from last year’s profit. The next meeting is scheduled for January 11, 2011 at 3:30 pm at Board Office Conf. Room.

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**Legislation** – Ms. Reinkober

My legislation report is also my OSBA Capital Conference report. There is uncertainty and speculation as to what the November election results will mean to school districts in the state. Governor-elect Kasich is promising change. His overall priorities during his campaign were job creation, shrinking government, reducing spending and reducing taxes. As far as education is concerned, he wants money spent in the classroom and less in overhead. He supports vouchers and charters; accountability for student performance in public and charter schools; eliminating unfunded mandates and discontinuing the Evidence Based Model for school funding. It is unlikely that we will see much out of the legislature before the new year and then they will be dealing with the anticipated shortfall in the state budget.

**Financial Advisory Committee** – Mrs. Reinkober gave the following report:

The committee met on November 3 and discussed the assumptions in the 5 year forecast. Board members received the 5 year forecast and accompanying notes last week. The committee discussed the potential loss of revenue from the state with the change in administration and concern with the upcoming state budget. Also, local property tax revenue will remain flat with information from the city building department that there is little new construction anticipated in the next few years.

**Family and Civic Engagement Committee** – Mrs. Reinkober

The committee held its first meeting on October 25. The committee was created to fulfill a requirement of House Bill 1. It brings together school, community and agencies that through collaboration will identify resources that will help students be more successful.

The committee is in the process of reviewing state report card data from sub-groups, the data profiles of risk indicators (mobility, discipline and absences) for our buildings and needs assessment data provided by our district leadership team involved in the Ohio Improvement Process.

The goals for this year include becoming familiar with the data, developing relationships with the resources within the region and determining specific goals for the following year.

The next meeting is scheduled for January 25, 2011.

**Health and Wellness Committee**-Mr. Langshaw gave the following report:

The Health and Wellness Committee met on October 25th. The committee discussed the Board's policy on Wellness. An update on the Community Health and Wellness Fair was given. The committee discussed what health and wellness information should be posted on the district's website. The committee also discussed BMI screening mandate that Senate Bill 210 calls for; the district will opt out of doing this until our district and others feel it is important to do so. The current law allows the district a wavier from having to do this. A legislative update was given, HB 19 calls for dating violence prevention, recognize characteristics of a healthy relationship; currently it is part of our health curriculum in 7th and 11th grade. The district unfortunately did not get the CAPA Grant, which is a comprehensive program to deal with chemical dependency and abuse issues.

The committee also discussed the purpose of the new Family and Civic Engagement Committee that has been formed; this is something HB 1 called for. There was discussion on what role the wellness committee can play in the terms of parent education component in relationship with wellness activities. The committee received an update on the Bake Goods Policy which was implemented this year. The current bake goods list will be improved; however no changes will be made during this school year. The committee received updates on Operation Keepsake, Coordinated Approach to Child Health, and Get Active Get Fit programs. The next committee meeting will be held on January 25th, 2011. The first Health, Wellness & Community Expo sponsored by the North Royalton School District, Sports Rehab Consultants, and city of North Royalton was held on November 6th at the high school. Over 70 vendors from various healthcare, business, and civic organizations participated. There was also various health and wellness presentations by 5 guest speakers. American Red Cross held a Blood Drive. Folks in attendance had an opportunity to health screenings that included: Flu Shots, BMI, Blood Pressure, and much more. The city held its' 10th Annual 5k Bear Run. I know I promised at our last board meeting to do the Bear Run but, I turkey out literally to participate in the 2nd annual Turkey Trot/walk at the stadium track with our elementary school students, parents, and staff. The can food items and donations all benefited the North Royalton Food Bank. Thank you to all those who help make this event possible! I hope and look forward to doing this again next year!

**School Green Team**- Mr. Langshaw

No report for School Green Team.

**City Earth Energy Environment Committee**- Mr. Langshaw gave the following report:

The City Earth Energy Environment Committee met on November 1st. The city's recycling program is doing well and participation continues to rise. Ace Hardware has sold out of the blue bins for recycling. They are expected to receive a new order of bins that should be available sometime on November 15th. The committee received news that Town Planner will not be printed in 2011. The person who holds the franchise for North Royalton is unable to print the Planner in 2011. So instead the city will be doing an insert in the Royalton Recorder to provide residents with information about the city's recycling rules. This insert is paid for by a county grant the city received. The committee was also informed that the city received a grant of \$287,000 from Northeast Ohio Public Energy Council to make the city's police station more energy efficient. The improvements are expected to help save the city \$10,000 annually based on current utility rates. The next EEE Committee meeting will sometime next year in early January or February.

**Policy Committee**- Mr. Langshaw gave the following report:

Policy Committee did not have a meeting this month. The Policy Committee will be meeting tentatively some time in December to go over the 2010 policy updates from NEOLA.

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**OSBA Capital Conference**- Mr. Langshaw gave the following report:

On November 7th I attended the Ohio School Boards Association's Capital Conference down in Columbus. Because of my work schedule I was only able to attend the Early Bird Workshop which featured Alan November, an international leader in educational technology and university lecturer. I found his suggestions on how to improve student critical thinking skills, collaboration, and using technology in the classroom so that students can be better prepared for the global economy that we live in. It was all very interesting. What stood out the most was from me was the importance for school leaders to be more open minded to embracing new technologies such as Facebook, Skype, Youtube, and others as tools to help our students in their studies.

**Roundtable Discussion** -Mr. Langshaw gave the following report:

I just want to give the board another update on the educational roundtable discussion for schools in Ohio's 24th Senate District that I have been working to organize with North Olmsted School Board Member Terry Groden. The roundtable is for board members and administrators from school districts in the 24th Ohio Senate District. The topic is "Preserving our funding in the next state budget." It will be held on January 12, 2011 at 7pm at North Olmsted Administrative Building, 27425 Butternut Ridge Rd., North Olmsted, Ohio. 11 different school districts have already expressed an interest in participating. There will be a panel of experts. These are folks who are familiar with school funding issues and/or the legislative process in Ohio. The format is still being developed, but it will include prepared questions from participating school districts for the panel and a Q & A session for the audience towards the end of the roundtable. I will continue to keep the board posted on the progress of this.

**Building and Grounds** – Mr. Reinhard gave the following report:

1. Maintenance Dept continues to make modifications and adjustments to the heating systems in the buildings. Due to the age of the equipment, the department spends a lot of time adjusting the system on a annual basis to try to regulate and control the temperatures in the classrooms and the entire buildings.
2. Maintenance Department is in the process of finishing to get all of the plow equipment and snow blowers ready for the winter season.
3. With the conclusion of the fall sports season, we are finishing to close down both the soccer and football stadium for the winter months.
4. The maintenance personnel are making several needed repairs and modifications to playground equipment at the three elementary buildings.

**Transportation** – Mr. Reinhard submitted the following report:

The annual T-1 report which we completed in October showed nice gains in efficiency. Ridership is up 83 students per day and we are traveling 377 less miles per day. Versatrans software proved to be a great tool. These numbers could not have been achieved without the effort of everyone involved in routing, Cathy Szabo, Bruce Abbott, Sandi Burger, and George Hasek.

We continue to increase involvement in professional development. Mechanic, Al DiGiandomenico attended the Ohio School Bus Mechanics Association two-day workshop in Columbus. Mechanic, T.J. Fitzgerald attended a one-day International School Bus training class on computer engine and body diagnostics. I attended a seminar in Columbus on routing efficiency put on by the Ohio Department of Education.

Back in the shop, Jon Capadona is phasing in the new Versatrans Fleetvision software. The software showed the mechanics completed 76 repair orders in the month of October. We had our first Highway Patrol spot inspection today. The H.P. only spent half the day here with the outcome of 7 out of 7 passing inspection.

Transportation Appeals Committee met this morning at the Board Office.

- 95%-100% of the corner markers (installed by the city for snow plowing) for winter stops are up.
- Three appeals were heard.
- The committee discussed revising day care routes for 2011-2012.
- The next meeting is scheduled for Wednesday, March 16, 2011 at 9:30am at the Board Office.

**OSBA Capitol Conference** – Mr. Reinhard

Report on session: Involving the public in facilities planning.

In 2008, Huber Heights, near Dayton, involved the community in the process of constructing new schools with the development of a district master plan.

The district established focus groups, held public meetings, and publicized their efforts in various community forums. At the conclusion of this, they determined to replace all buildings in the system and reduce elementary schools from 5 to 3. Some of their buildings were near 100 years old. A bond issue was proposed to fund the schools portion of the projected \$168 million cost. The schools were eligible to receive 52% State funding for the project. Various strategies to promote the schools portion, 48%, and pass a bond issue were discussed.

The bond issue passed and construction started last year and will continue until completed in 2012.

As a footnote, when construction is completed in 2 years, the schools will be need to seek approval of an additional operating levy since their 5 year forecast will show a deficit whether the new buildings had been built or not.
